Implementation Of Urban Community Empowerment Program In Gebang Putih SubDistrict, Sukolilo District Surabaya Community

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Abstract - Implementation of accountability for the progress of the revolving of community self-help program funds (repair of uninhabitable houses), can run well during the period May 1 to June 30 2022, the whole community in Gebang Putih Village, Sukolilo District, Surabaya can reap the economic benefits along with increasing aspects of impact social. In order to enjoy decent housing on an ongoing basis through the management of the Gebang Barokah community self-help agency (multi-year program), especially a group of people in the Gebang Putih Village, Sukolilo District, Surabaya, today. The target location of the activity includes the administrative area of the government of Gebang Putih Village, Sukolilo District, Municipality of Surabaya (East Java Province). The functional goal is to accommodate and realize the entire implementation of program activities, starting from planning, implementation in the field and results along with the obstacles encountered during the implementation of program activities. The operational goal is the clear implementation of all activities, which include program actors, program targets (low-income people in quantity) and targets to be achieved as well as support for national programs/movements in order to realize the provision of clean and comfortable social environmental infrastructure sanitation in accordance with the proposed concept village investment program (KIP)-based environmental development independently with national integration.

Keywords: accountability, progress of revolving funds for community self-help programs, repair of uninhabitable houses.

I. INTRODUCTION

Empowerment is the concept most often used in community capacity building activities that emphasize the independence of the community. Community empowerment activities are a conceptuality of economic sector development activities that cover all the social values of society (Alfitri, 2011). Empowering the community is an effort to increase the dignity of the grassroots layer of society which, with all its limitations, has not been able to escape from the trap of poverty, ignorance and backwardness, so that community empowerment is not only strengthening individuals but also existing social institutions (Noor, 2011). Mardikanto & Poerwoko, (2012) explained that the direction of empowerment consists of various efforts to:

Empowering Education Empowering Basic Joint Marketing & Finance Business Empowering Joint Basic Knowledge Education Empowering Institutions/Partnerships. Empowering the Business Sector Empowering the Income Sector Empowering Environmental Facilities Empowering Lifestyles Empowering Communities

The appearance of conceptuality in activities is an effort to strengthen social capital owned by a group of community members. Where the essence of empowerment rests on the joints of the transfer of power through the strengthening of social capital in a community. In order to make them more potential and keep away from unproductive behaviors today (Zubaedi, 2013). In an empowerment activity that is specified for the community, as well as empowerment apparatus, it is important to carry out some basic principles in the empowerment activity, so that it becomes a reference for the implementer so that the activities carried out are directed and

targeted according to the mission or conceptuality of the empowerment activity (Aswas, 2014). Empowerment refers to the ability of a person related to vulnerable and powerless communities so that they have a source of strength and ability in:

Fulfillment of tertiary needs so that they are liberated regarding their opinions. Reach to vital economic sources, income can increase, participate in development activities and strategic decisions (Suharto, 2015). Community empowerment is an effort to increase the dignity of layers of society who are currently unable to escape the trap of poverty and destitution. (Theresa, 2019). The new paradigm related to poverty solutions refers to fair and equitable conceptualities, democratic participation through a market mechanism and mutual trust to create feelings of security. Where the approach that must be implemented related to poverty alleviation is a community empowerment program that positions the community as the main actor, where the government functions as a facilitator and motivator in these development activities (Sumodiningrat, 2019). Empowerment is intended to provide opportunities for the less fortunate layers of society to increase the glory and self-esteem of the community independently. Sudarmanto, et al (2020) define community empowerment as an effort to develop certain strata of community life that are in poor and underdeveloped conditions. There are two things that are most important in understanding community empowerment: 1. It is an effort to give power and transfer power and transfer authority to other parties who are being empowered today. 2. It is an effort to bestow capabilities or optimize an empowerment (Nugroho, et al 2020).

The increasingly rapid development of the population today in the urban area of Surabaya, has made community stakeholders work hard to rearrange the concept of urban spatial planning in accordance with the growth in population which continues to increase every year. This makes the stakeholders try as optimally as possible to re-conserve their urban spatial empowerment through greening the environment program along with big city community empowerment programs through the help of several non-governmental organizations that are directly involved in desistrizing the scope of urban planning with the concept of natural open spaces to cool the lungs. particularly densely populated cities. The redevelopment of human settlements is inseparable from the determination and motto of Mrs. Tri Rismaharini as a pioneer of stakeholders who always strives hard through her Amdal team to achieve the city of Surabaya as a clean, green Adipura city far from the image of slums with the concept of environmental destrization with the concept of green ecology.

This is inseparable from the hard work of the Surabaya city planning department to revitalize residential villages in all corners of Surabaya, in order to preserve their homes so that they look beautiful and natural. In principle, there is no single way that can overcome the problem of poverty, if the main problem that is hindering social problems is not uprooted. This means that the poverty alleviation program is an alternative development model that refers to a cultural approach to empowerment, as a prerequisite for sustainable development. If the social scope of a particular community living in urban areas is able to overcome the problems of poverty they experience. Undoubtedly, this community group is able to empower themselves and their families to form a development of a harmonious, beautiful, clean and comfortable residential environment for their community group in the long term.

This is a reflection of the hope for the Surabaya city planning agency to launch a green ecology program in a sustainable manner to support the revitalization and redevelopment of residential areas of Surabaya residents who are densely populated and have low social status. In order to maintain the beauty of environmental sanitation for community groups living in the area and prevent people from social upheavals of poverty and unemployment so they can live more prosperously through the approach of a sustainable and sustainable community empowerment program independently and integrated.

The main target of this community empowerment activity is in the form of self-management of the home renovation program for the pre-prosperous 1 poor community through cyclical revolving of funds (instalments) which is managed independently by the Gebang Barokah community self-help agency to actualize environmental sanitation programs that can reflect sanitation and hygiene according to environmental governance. urban based on the conceptual of planology for modern sub-urban. So that the communality of the small community in the urban scope, is able to enjoy housing that has standard eligibility for housing, especially for a group of pre-prosperous class 1 people who live in Gebang Putih Village, Sukolilo District, Surabaya today.

II. METHOD

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The procedure for carrying out the home renovation program on a self-help/self-managed basis is formed through technical guidelines agreed upon by all RT and RW officials backed up by the Gebang Putih Village, Sukolilo District, Surabaya. The challenge in this community service is the collection of non-grant social assistance funds (because they must be returned in installments per 2-month cycle). Which must be recorded in the form of posting a daily balance sheet, trial balance, profit and loss report, and reports on changes in capital every 2 months). As a form of financial management accountability activity, so that social funds can be rotated periodically. And it is specifically intended for poor, pre-prosperous class 1 families in Gebang Putih Village, Sukolilo District, Surabaya, to support the village-wide destrization program in the municipality of Surabaya today.

The method of collecting community service data is carried out by the social group in charge of financial activities in the form of embodiment of financial reporting which is made periodically every 2 months for the period May 1 - June 30 2022 today. The method used in this community service activity is the advocacy method: a mentoring activity for poor family members of the pre-prosperous class 1 who want to renovate their house. Through the establishment of a special self-management team for house renovation technical assistance in a nominal amount of IDR 4 million to IDR 5 million in the form of building materials: bricks, cement, sand and coral stone in installments per 2 months in the long term (multi-year program).

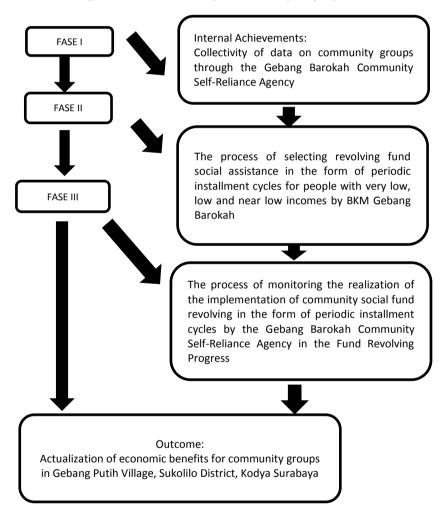


Figure 1. Implementation of Community Service

Explanation:

Phase 1 indicates that the target location for community empowerment program activities has been mapped according to the administrative area of the Gebang Putih Village, Sukolilo Kodya Subdistrict, Surabaya as a whole, and phase 2 indicates that the actualization process of functional objectives for implementing community empowerment activities starts from the planning and implementation stages. in the field along with

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the obstacles that must be faced during the assistance activities of the self-help program in Gebang Putih Village, Sukolilo District, phase 3 indicates the realization of progress on the operational goals of the self-help program that has achieved the vision that has been proclaimed through the activity of monitoring progress in cycle installments for community participant objects Gebang Putih Sukolilo who has participated in an independent and integrated community empowerment program. Where the output results indicate the success of the management team of the Gebang Barokah Community Self-Reliance Agency in being able to appreciate the increase in socio-economic status for the survival of community participants in Gebang Putih Village, Sukolilo District, Kodya Surabaya today.

The target criteria for beneficiaries of the Gebang Barokah non-governmental organization program are poor people according to the references and formula for poverty criteria agreed upon by local residents in the Gebang Putih Village, Sukolilo District, Surabaya, including people who have been poor for a long time (structural poverty). or whose income has decreased and is meaningless due to the recession, and has lost their source of income due to the prolonged Covid-19 pandemic.

Implementation of Uninhabitable House Repair/Renovation Activities

Initial funds for the process of carrying out renovation/repair activities for low-income people's houses in the Gebang Putih sub-district were received on December 27, 2004 in the amount of IDR 60,000,000 (sixty million rupiah). Agreed and agreed on the following:

- The loan repayment period for uninhabitable house renovations is agreed upon for 10 calendar months.
- Loan administration services are approved and charged at 1.0% per month, on a flat basis.
- The proportion of administrative services of 1.0% is agreed upon and allocated as follows:
- 1. 0.50 % is allocated as operational costs for the Institute (BOP-LLPPRS)
- 2. 0.30% is allocated as capital development efforts
- 3. 0.20% is allocated as post-project assistance services

In the first period, on January 11, 2005, funds were rolled out to 10 program beneficiaries/KK, with allocated funds of Rp. 7,495,500 (seven million four hundred ninety five thousand five hundred rupiah). In this report for the period May 1 2022 to June 30 2022, the funds will be rolled out to 20 program beneficiaries with an allocation of Rp. 42,500,000 (forty two million five hundred thousand rupiah). So that all funds that have been rolled out to the pre-prosperous and prosperous 1 community in the Gebang Putih sub-district as of June 30 2022, have reached 126 (one hundred and twenty six) program beneficiaries of 4 (four) KSM & 4 (four) PKK groups. All of these beneficiaries have achieved around 40% of the community empowerment program target in Gebang Putih Village, which reached 455 pre-prosperous and prosperous 1 families, with a nominal allocated fund of IDR 268,158,500 (two hundred sixty eight hundred million one hundred fifty eight thousand five

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hundred rupiah). Thus, the financial position of non-governmental organizations as of June 30, 2022 is as follows:

- The cash balance of the self-help agency reached a value of IDR 187,470.57 (one hundred eighty seven thousand four hundred seventy rupiah fifty seven cents).
- Receivables from the Institution to 37 (thirty seven) families that benefited from the program reached a value of IDR 61,832,000 (sixty one million eight hundred thirty two thousand rupiah).
- So that the total capital of the self-help agency is Rep 62,014,4185.15, (sixty two million fourteen thousand four hundred and eighty five rupiah and fifteen cents).
